Welcome to the spring 2010 newsletter for the Delta Chapter of St. Anthony Hall. The purpose of this newsletter is to keep our graduate brothers informed about the activities of St. Anthony Hall on the Penn campus.



We are a fraternity of scholars, musicians and athletes. Our commitment to the community, to the University and to ourselves remains strong.

Throughout the 2009-2010 academic year, the undergraduate brothers experienced success. Five brothers competed on Penn's squash team this past Winter, including junior James Clark '08, who was elected team captain at the end of the season. Various undergraduates competed for the University's lacrosse, track, and football teams. Andrew Pohly '10 was a defensive back on Penn's varsity football team which won the Ivy League title in 2009.

Off the athletic fields, brothers were involved in the Mask & Wig club, headed the Penn Fund, and founded the "Power Up Gambia" initiative to provide solar power to various African nations. Undergraduate involvement in the Penn community is strong.

I'm proud to report that the undergraduates excelled in the classroom. Recently, the University granted St. Anthony Hall an award for "Outstanding Academic Achievement." This accolade is given to a small number of Greek houses on campus, and we are proud of our accomplishment.

I must recognize our past undergraduate president, JP Beaulac '07, as the driving force behind the Hall's recent success. I'm pleased to report that JP, as well as former Delta Alumni Association president Alex Cook '74, received awards from the Administration for their leadership over the past year. DELTA HISTORY

The Delta Chapter of St. Anthony Hall was founded at the University of Pennsylvania on December 27, 1854. In 1909, the Chapter moved to its current location at 3637 Locust Walk, Philadelphia, PA 19104 in the center of Penn's Campus and across the street from Penn's Wharton School of Business.

The house was built by Cope & Stewardson and in 2005 was added to the National Register of Historic places.

The Delta Alumni Association was incorporated in Pennsylvania in 1912, and is concerned with the scholastic standing of the undergraduates and the maintenance of St. Anthony Hall at 3637 Locust Walk. In 2005, the St. Anthony 1907 Foundation, a tax-exempt, non-profit organization, was formed to help fund preservation projects for this historic building.

The Delta Chapter is one of the three all-male St. Anthony Hall chapters, the other two being at the University of Mississippi and the University of Virginia.

DELTA CHAPTER NEWS

The Delta chapter has 49 fraternity brothers, of whom 12 are graduating seniors, 12 are juniors, 15 are sophomores and 10 are freshmen pledges.

Our brothers have varied interests with 5 on the Varsity Squash team, 1 on the Varsity Lacrosse team, and 1 involved in Mask & Wig, the group at Penn that authors, produces and performs a musical comedy each year.


Mark Froot '07 captains the Varsity Squash team, which won the Hoehn Cup, capturing 9th place in the nation. **Brothers Thomas Mattson '09, James Clark '08, Trevor McGuiness '08 and Will Browne '08** contributed to the team's success. **Thomas Hawkins '08** captains the Varsity Lacrosse team.

Charles Lynch '09 is the band leader and alto saxophonist for the Mask & Wig band, composing and arranging original songs. He is a Vice Chairman of the Penn Fund, which is a University initiative to gain future alumni support from the graduating senior class.

Community Service

The Delta Chapter's contribution to community service includes active roles in the Relay for Life, Power Up Gambia and City Step. **Brother Ben Daly '07** climbed Mt. Kilimanjaro over his Christmas vacation to raise money for AIDS awareness.

Thomas Truxton Hare Delta 1987 Award



Clarke Amartis '07 is the recipient this year of the Thomas Truxton Hare Delta 1897 Award which is given to the undergraduate member of the Delta Chapter of St. Anthony Hall who has shown passion and commitment as a Varsity athlete and as a contributor to literary meetings in the Hall.

Truxton Hare, in whose memory the award is given, established a standard of excellence at Penn and at St. Anthony Hall. (Pictured on right wearing his Hall pin.)

At Penn, Truxton was a natural athlete, excelling at cricket, football, track, archery, trapshooting and golf. In football, he led the Quakers to victory during his four years on the varsity team. He is one of 7 players in college football history to be elected All-American in four years of playing. He was captain of the Red & Blue's varsity 11 during his final two seasons.

In 1951, he was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame. In 2008, *Sports Illustrated* did a retrospective look at who would have won the Heisman trophy from 1900 – 1934 (prior to the award's existence) and named Hare as a unanimous choice for 1900. While an undergraduate, Hare brought home a silver medal for the hammer throw at the 1900 Olympics in Paris. In the 1904 Olympics in St. Louis, he won a bronze medal in the decathlon.

Off the athletic field, Hare was prolific. A writer and a painter, he was a member of the Sphinx Senior Society, the Ancient and Honorable Order of the Sons of Rest (poetry), and acted in Mask and Wig productions during his sophomore, junior and senior years. As a member of the St. Anthony Hall, Hare was a social leader. He served as toastmaster at class banquets, chair of dance committees, and custodian of the Bowl during his sophomore year. He was elected president of his freshman class and Spoon Man in his senior year.

After college, Hare received a law degree from Penn and practiced law in the Philadelphia area. He wrote eight books about a young boy maturing from boarding school to starring on his college football team and finishing as a graduate coach...a topic Hare knew well.



Stan Moyer '48, Delta Alumni Association Board Member, Retires

A hallmark of our fraternity has been the dedication and loyalty of our alumni. **Brother Stan Moyer '48** recently retired from the Board of the Delta Alumni Association when his term expired at the end of 2009. After serving on the Board for many years, Brother Moyer said he wanted to provide the opportunity for younger members to serve. Stan is a former Trustee of the University of Pennsylvania. We would like to thank him for the time and effort he spent over the years making St. Anthony Hall a better place.

During his undergraduate years, Brother Moyer was selected to serve on the Houston Hall Board and was a member of the Friars Senior Society. Later, he served on the Board of Directors for Mask & Wig, and in 1984 received the Alumni Award of Merit from the University of Pennsylvania.

About 10 years ago, Brother Moyer wrote about his life at Penn and at St. Anthony Hall. He mentioned that across Locust Walk from the Hall (where Steinberg Hall stands) was a parking lot. He rowed lightweight crew his freshman year and was an active member of Mask & Wig his last 3 years.

Brother Moyer recently wrote that while he "was a prep school guy from Penn Charter, ... most of [the other brothers were] back from the big WAR [and] having graduated from boarding schools in various locations. ... It was a great experience knowing them and [I] remember seeing monthly checks for \$75 from the GI Bill waiting for them on our Hall table."

Joe Gaskins was the house manager who cleaned up after their parties, "always with a smile." When Stan graduated, he "joined Smith Barney... at \$3,500, which was a high level at that time."

Besides being "an alumni trustee of the University," he was "on the Medical Center Board and the Investment Board" because he "knew it was important ... to give back as much" as he could. Stan and his wife Ann live in Bryn Mawr, PA.

Delta Brothers Celebrate 50th Penn Reunion at 3637 Locust Walk

On Saturday, May 15, 2010, the St. Anthony Hall class which was initiated in '57 celebrated its 50th Anniversary of their graduation from Penn. A dinner for the returning brothers, which was organized by **Jim Mitchell '57** and **Bill Bryan '97**, with support from the St. Anthony Club of Philadelphia, was held at 3637 Locust Walk.

The brothers of '57 in attendance were "**FS**" **Allen**, **Larry Glenn**, **Bill Hoff**, **Jim Mitchell**, **Fred Muller**, **George Smith** and **Joe Weed**.

Jim Mitchell remarked that a tour of the Hall "brought back fond memories" and that "the dinner on Saturday night was a highlight of the weekend." He said he hoped "future classes will make this [Hall reunion and dinner] a tradition."

Delta Brother Publishes Novel, *Octopus Summer*



Brother Malcolm Dorson '03, a former President of the Fraternity and currently a private banker, has published his first novel, *Octopus Summer*.

Callum Littlefield, the protagonist, in one summer finds love, adventure, death, and heartbreak. As an outsider with an insider's view of New York society, Callum presents a social commentary on his blue blood surroundings. Through his relationships with his mother, grandmother, nanny and Hellenic girlfriend, Callum learns how his adolescent behavior no longer works as a man.

Dorson credited the Hall with providing the atmosphere which led to the novel when he commented, "The book started with laughter and storytelling at the Hall, which I turned into 5 or 6 LDs, which I eventually expanded into a novel."


Browne went to the Middle East to film the story of Bnei Sakhnin, a soccer team owned by an Arab, fielding Jewish and Arab players, and coached by a Jew. Representing Israel, the team won the Israeli Cup in European competition.

Browne's fondness for stories was kindled at Penn and at The Hall. Browne recently said, "Those Wednesday nights of camaraderie, and tales of male mishaps and triumphs instilled in me a love and respect for the power of stories."

Sports Illustrated gave the documentary 4 stars, ESPN said "it's 90 minutes of how powerful sports' films can be" and "*Variety* called it "an energetic, edge-of-your-seat genuine crowd-pleaser."

On Tuesday, May 18, 2010, Jack Bell wrote an article "An Arab Hero In Israel, on Film And on the Field" for the *New York Times* in which Christopher Browne, the film's director, is quoted as saying, "This was my toughest assignment..."

SUPPORTING ST. ANTHONY HALL

After reading this newsletter, I hope you will agree that the Delta Chapter of St. Anthony Hall is worthy of your financial support.

The St. Anthony Hall building on Locust Walk has capital projects waiting to be funded. A tax-deductible contribution to St. Anthony 1907 Foundation would help in this regard.

The essential projects waiting for funding include:

- Electrical upgrade to replace the early 1900s electrical service - \$75,000
- Pantry repair, including two new dishwashers - \$10,000
- Kitchen upgrade, including new floor - \$7,000
- Roof repair - \$10,000

Quality of life improvements include:

- Ground floor bathroom upgrade (including handicap access) - \$40,000
- Library upgrade honoring E. Digby Baltzell - \$40,000
- New rug for Bruce Hooper Dining Room - \$8,000
- Air conditioning chiller - \$89,000

While over 350 of our 750 Delta alumni have made generous gifts totaling \$2,000,000 to the St. Anthony 1907 Foundation to help refurbish 3637 Locust Walk, the renovations to date have used up all but \$120,000. Spending that balance would leave nothing for endowing the Hall as I had originally planned. As with any well-used 100 year old building, capital repairs and improvements are always in front of us.
